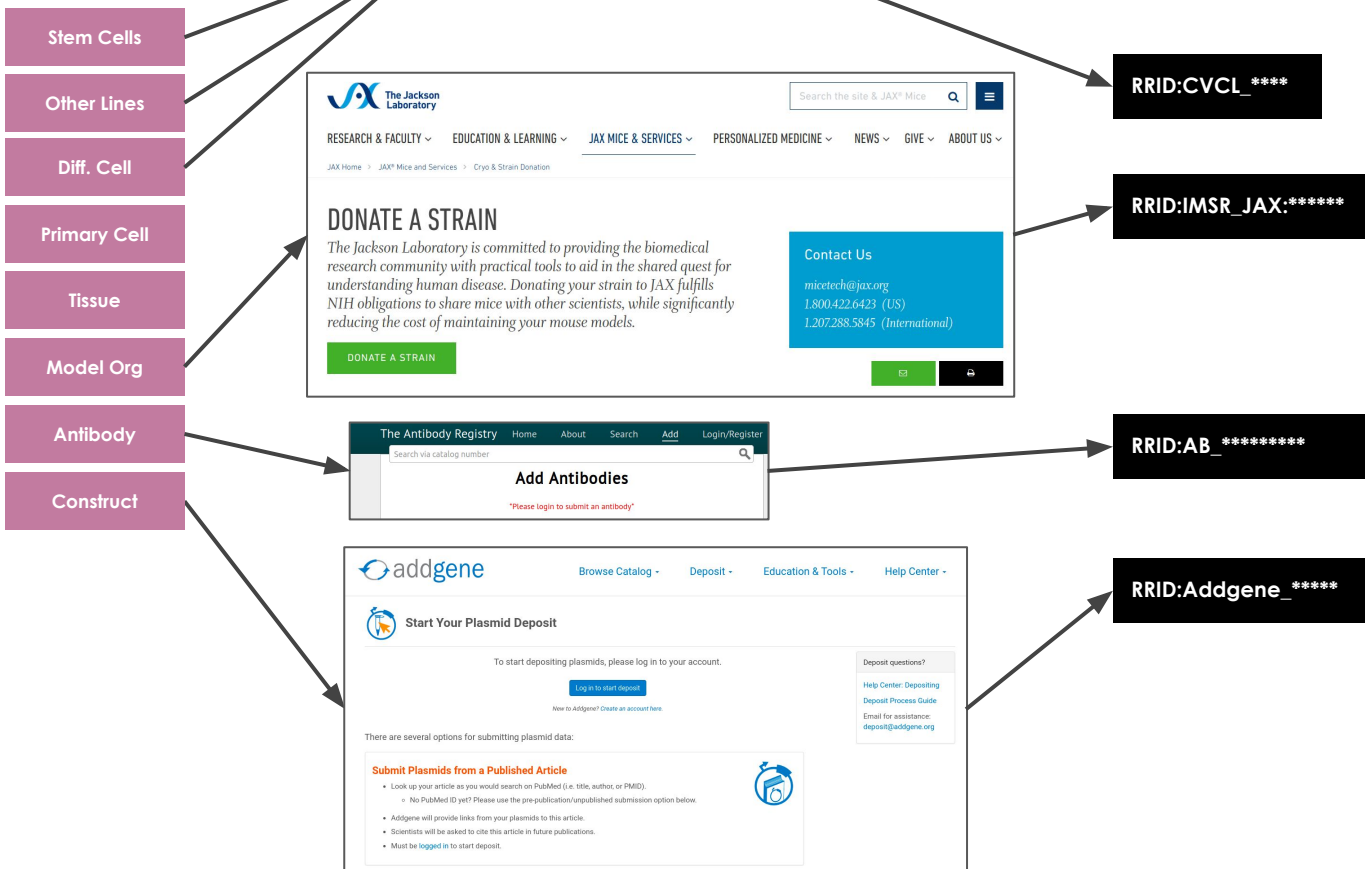


Process for depositing and documenting Biosample resources

ex. CanonicalId

The CanonicalId is an accession assigned by a canonical database or a doi. After depositing your resource in the appropriate place, you get a record for it (also view the ID as a "receipt" for going through the proper transaction with an official resource bank/registrar).



In some cases the Curator will be able to register your cell lines, but this is often not possible due to missing information. The Curator will try to contact you to start the process.

The Curator *cannot* deposit your mice for you but will try to create a preliminary entry based on your published description -- which you should later update with an ID and additional details about your resource.

In most cases, the Curator will be able to register your antibodies (because it does not need to be under a specific account) and transfer the information to the Resource Browser. When this is not possible due to missing information, the Curator will try to contact you to start the process.

The Curator *cannot* deposit your constructs for you, but will try to create a preliminary entry based on your published description -- which you should later update with an ID and additional details about your resource.
